## LEADERS ACROSS BORDERS

### **OUR HISTORY**

In 1993, Mission: Restore co-founder and Chair, Dr. Kaveh Alizadeh began his volunteer work in Afghan refugee camps. It was a lifechanging experience for him and since then, he has participated in volunteer missions each year, traveling all over the world including Central America, South America, the Middle East, and Asia. In 2009, Dr. Alizadeh's humanitarian volunteer work earned him the



prestigious Ellis Island Medal of Honor. After over a decade of volunteering with organizations that only delivered surgeries on location with limited follow-up, Dr. Alizadeh sought out to create a more sustainable solution. In 2010, he recruited a group of physicians and founded a new kind of surgical non-profit organization that focused on the most costeffective and impactful way to create long-term sustainable change through education. The result was Mission: Restore, a 501c(3) non-profit that provides local surgeons the knowledge, skills, and support needed to treat patients in communities around the world.



## **MISSIONS UNDERTAKEN**

Since its inception, Mission: Restore has taught and provided medical care to people in various countries around the world. So far, our mission trips have taken us to:

In each of these countries, we have performed surgical procedures and trained the next generation of local surgeons to perform the latest reconstructive surgical techniques. Our work has helped facilitate growth of sustainable medical care in communities where resources are limited.



## WHAT WE DO



#### **Surgical Training Visits**

The surgeons who volunteer with Mission: Restore visit various countries where they provide hands-on training and education to develop the skillset neccessary for local doctors and surgeons to perform life-changing surgical procedures.



#### **Surgical Education Grants**

We provide surgical education grants to assist in supporting promising, young, community-minded doctors to start and continue their plastic and reconstructive surgery training.



#### Telemedicine

Mission: Restore provides ongoing remote virtual consultations, mentoring and monitoring of outcomes where surgeons learn from mentors abroad.



#### **Regional Trainings**

Mission: Restore organizes multi-day workshops in local communities where surgeons are able to come together to learn the latest surgical methods and expand their professional network.

## IMPACT

With Mission: Restore's volunteer physicians and the assistance of generous contributors and organizations, we have been able to make an incredible impact on the world through medical training.

To date, Mission: Restore has been able to make the following impact:

- Surgeons Trained: 300
- Complex surgeries performed: 1,000
- Telemedicine consultations: 1,500
- Hours of hands-on trainings: 2,500

Mission: Restore's goal is to continue to innovate and improve lives throughout the world by expanding the capacity of surgeons around the world to perform surgical procedures. Your contribution helps us reach our goal.
